Cleaning Products

Quick 10

Quick 10 claims it can any stain from any carpeted or upholstered surface...but Does it Work?



There have been a ton of products that claim to be able remove stains from carpets and upholsteries. I have tried numerous ones and few if any have completely removed stains.

Now comes along Quick 10 from Instagone products which claims it can remove those nasty food, drink, mud, and pretty much whatever else that could stain your carpets and upholsteries with. Well, I had to find out, Does It Work?

Instagone Products sent me a bottle of the cleanser, a colorfast cloth for cleaning, a refill packet of Quick 10 and a pre-stained swatch of carpet with coffee and wine stains.

The instructions state to vacuum the area first, then apply a stream of Quick 10 to the stained area. You then have to wait 2-3 minutes to allow the product to soak in.

After waiting, I easily removed both stains by simply blotting and rubbing the colorfast cloth provided. I was really not amazed that the stains came off so easily. I would have been worried if Quick 10 wouldn't have been able to remove the stains sent to us by the company.

Now it was time to really put Quick 10 to the test. I decided to roam our studios looking for stains.

My first stop was the promotions office. There the Does It Work crew found a stain that appeared to be soda water that has been there for years! Well, it was time to see if Quick 10 was as good as it claimed.

We sprayed a portion of the stain and waited 3 minutes. After waiting, I was shocked that with very little effort, I was able to wipe away a stain that steam machines feared. I was sold on this product, but I needed to test it on cars as well.

Our news units take a ton of abuse day in and day out. Dirt, mud, drink and all sorts of stains were on the floorboard of the vehicle I decided to try it on. After spraying and waiting, those stains were a distant memory.



Well, our promotions manager Michael Thornton wanted to try Quick 10 himself. So he took the carpet sample I had already cleaned, and drew all over it with a permanent ink marker. Now Quick 10 never claimed it would remove permanent ink, but we decided to give it a shot anyway.

After spraying and soaking Michael was able to remove most of the permanent ink. The bottle stated that you may have to repeat the process to completely remove a stain, so we did. After repeating, the stain nearly disappeared. Pretty good for a product that never claimed to remove permanent ink.



I would wholeheartedly recommend this product. It retails at \$9.99 a bottle and can be ordered online at www.quick10.com. My only suggestion is to follow the directions carefully, allow Quick 10 to soak in before you try to rub the stain away.
